Mid-Week Bible reading

Psalm 98

A psalm.

 Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvellous things; his right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him.
 The Lord has made his salvation known and revealed his righteousness to the nations.
 He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to Israel; all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

- Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth, burst into jubilant song with music;
 make music to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the sound of singing,
 with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn—shout for joy before the Lord, the King.
- Let the sea resound, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.
 Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together for joy;
 let them sing before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth.
 He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity.

This Psalm makes the point that when God's judgement is made at the end of this age it will be a very good thing, a time for celebration, a time of joy and a time to sing a new song.

God's justice, while overwhelming and complete is not something to be feared, because God's judgment will be a time of restorative justice, a time when bad things are reversed, when God will be "making everything new" (Rev 21: 5) when "He will wipe every tear from their eyes and there will be no more death or morning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away" (Rev 21:4).

It will be a time when God "will repay you for the years the locusts have eaten—the great locust and the young locust, the other locusts and the locust swarm —my great army that I sent among you."

God's justice is not something for a Christian to fear. On the contrary when all wrongs are made right, when God's righteousness is established across the whole world, when all tyrants are defeated and God's peace reigns then this is something that all God's people will welcome with joy.

The "new song" will be the response of this new creation and the whole of creation will sing it. The Psalmist tells us that God's people (Israel) will sing it first because: "He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to Israel". He promised to save his people and He is faithful to that promise. Jesus, the cross, resurrection, and new life, are together God's answer to that promise. But it doesn't stop there. The exuberate joy resonates across the whole world because He comes to judge the whole earth.

Justice and righteousness will be universally experienced. He has "revealed his righteousness to the nations" and "He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity". And we should expect that God's justice will be perfect justice and far more fair and equitable and just than any human justice given in any human court. Again, this will be welcome, not only by all who live in the world, but by the whole earth itself:

- ⁷Let the sea resound, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.
- ⁸Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together for joy;
- ⁹ let them sing before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth.

The Palmist writes about the future as if it is already a reality and this work of God calls for a response - "Sing to the Lord a new song, for He has done marvellous things".

That's the reality. Christ's work is finished, and we live each day in sure expectation of the coming of the King. We are part of that new song.
